AA Team Selection Rules



The House team selection rules only apply to the AA baseball division.

- The team selection order will be determined by drawing numbers.
- Each team may have 1 representative present to participate in the team selection process.
- The team selection process will be conducted using a “snake draft” process, whereby the team that picks last in one round will pick first in the next round. For example, if there are 12 teams, the team that picks the 12th player will also pick the 13th player.
- The players of managers, coaches, and sponsors have been pre-assigned to teams.
- Players will be selected by tiers, starting with the older players and moving to the youngest players.
- If a team already has a player from a tier on their team due to the player being a manager’s, coach’s, or sponsor’s child, the team will skip picking that round. If a team has another pre-assigned player, the team will skip picking in the next round and so forth.
- Players with no workout score can be picked at any time in lieu of selecting a player from a listed tier.
- In the case of siblings that want to play on the same team, both players will be placed on the team roster when one of the siblings is selected. The team will skip picking in the round that the sibling would have been selected.
- No team may have more than five players from any one school.
- The team selection process is intended to be collaborative, not competitive. If, for example, another team wants a particular player due to a pre-existing relationship, please consider honoring this request as long as it does not upset the overall competitive balance.
- If a team representative has information about a player that would be helpful for other teams to know (e.g., change in a player’s practice night conflict, knowledge about the playing ability of an unrated player), the information should be shared prior to the start of the team selection process.
- Following the completion of the team selection process, the Player Agents will review the rosters and confirm the final rosters with each team manager.
Managers may NOT contact players or their families until the Player Agent confirms that their roster is final and ready to be released.

- Discussions that happen during the team selection process MUST stay in the draft room. Players should NOT know where they ranked in the spreadsheet or what was said about them. The spreadsheet should NOT be shared with any players or individuals who are not coaches.
